Palliative Care: Working in the Palliative care is both joyful and painful experience. In our locality people bring the patients in their last stage. Some breathe their last peacefully at the centre. Some have painful death. Many die after taking the last drop of water from our hands. We prepare them for peaceful death. In two years, of the 76 Patients who came to our palliative care, 46 died. Due to the care of the staff and the sisters many patients come to us in their last stage and they are grateful to us. We have witn essed some patients taking the name of Jesus and dying in His presence though they are Hindus and Muslims. We feel happy that we are fulfilling our charism by serving these patients. A cancer patient who was a Buddhist in our centre was heard saying "Jesus is coming to take me" and the very next day he died repeating the name of Jesus. Another patient who was in coma was healed miraculously. People know our hospital is for palliative care and so from Siliguri and the hills we get many patients along with the locals. We are happy our hospital is serving the patients whom we bless and send to heaven!

Alipurduar Mission: Lulled by a river, Alipurduar borders forest and tea gardens and the convent is in the middle of a paddy field as if situated in a green carpet. But the people inhabiting in this mission are backward, socially, economically and morally. We teach the children of the tea garden workers in the evening school so that they improve their educational standards. On 17<sup>th</sup> January 2018 we had organized a medical camp in Jeevan Jyoti Social Centre. Sr. Virginia F.C. Sr. Dibya F.C., Doctors and nurses from Navjeevan Hospital, Gayaganga gave free medical checkup and distributed medicines. Sr. Veronica Chungath had trained six girls in cutting and tailoring. One of them got married on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2018; her wedding expense was borne by the convent as part of our Sesquicentennial Jubilee gift. Four students are learning computer in our centre especially the programme 'Tally'. On 11<sup>th</sup> March 2018 we arranged for a day of prayer in our convent for the people of three villages around our house. Mr. David and Mr. Binay, Associates of the Daughters of the Cross from Pradhan Nagar conducted the prayer services. Fr. Suranjan Mundu the Assistant Parish priest also helped in this great event of healing and reconciliation. Around 100 people had gathered for this prayer. The day ended with Eucharistic celebration by 4 o'clock. Praise the Lord!


